## 1. Rationale

We believe that the wearing of uniform encourages children to have a sense of belonging and of being part of the community, which impacts positively on their wellbeing. It is an outward expression of the school's identity and promotes a feeling of pride and equality. In addition, we believe that the wearing of a 'uniform', as opposed to leisure wear, contributes to helping children understand that they come to school to work and learn.

## 2. Aims

- To ensure that children wear clothing which is safe and practical.
- To promote pride/ambition in their school and a sense of identity.
- To promote the idea of Golborne Community Primary School as a learning community and we expect exceptionally high standards.
- To promote the image of the school within the local area and the town.
- To eliminate competition amongst children in relation to what they wear (preventing bullying).
- To safeguard children, so when in the community, the public know what school they attend.

## 3. UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

School tie (Early Years and Key Stage 1 elasticated; Key Stage 2, clip on).

Navy blue school jumper or cardigan with the school logo.

Light blue collared shirt (no logo).

Navy blue trousers, skirt (knee length) or pinafore dress (no logo required).

Navy blue socks or tights (no patterns).

Black Shoes (no trainers, no leisure shoes and no boots above the ankle unless medically necessary).

Only analogue wrist watches can be worn (no digital or smart watches allowed).

### Winter:

- A warm knitted/winter hat (either with the school logo or a knitted/winter hat with no logo of any kind).

### Summer:

- Navy blue, light blue, yellow or green baseball caps are preferred (no caps with inappropriate language and/or images please).
- Plain navy blue shorts may be worn or navy blue gingham dresses (no boots unless medically necessary and a doctor's note must be provided).

### P.E. Kit (children will be allocated P.E days and they will come into school in their kits)

All children should come into school wearing as follows for P.E:

- A plain white T-shirt (with or without the logo) or polyester white T-shirt, with blue short sleeves (desirable).
- Plain navy blue shorts (no logo).
- Black pumps or trainers.
- Desirable: the navy blue quarter-zip outdoor sport's top, with the school logo on can be worn.
- A plain navy blue tracksuit may be worn, for P.E. outside and during winter (no branded logos).

Please mark all items of clothing with your child's name and class.

### Swimming Kit

All children should bring in, for swimming, the following:

- A donation of £3.00 to cover the cost of the coach and lessons.
- Swimming costume (no bikinis).
- Swimming trunks or shorts (must be above the knee).
- Towel.
- Swimming cap (with long hair).

If your child has a verucca/wart on their foot, they are to wear a verucca sock for the swimming lesson.

#### 4. Where to Buy From?

Many items are also available through most supermarket chains.

#### 5. Health and Safety

There are several health and safety issues which inform our school policy as follows:

- No jewellery should be worn except a wristwatch (not a smartwatch).
- Children with long hair need to have their hair tied back.
- No make-up is to be worn in school, including nail varnish and stick on tattoos. Parents/carers will be contacted, if nail varnish is worn.
- For pierced ears only stud earrings and these should be removed for P.E. (If children are unable to take studs out themselves these should be left at home on P.E. days. School staff are not permitted to remove any earrings). Plasters can be provided by parents/carers as well.
- Please ensure all of your child's clothing is named clearly, at all times.
